Swinton Avenue Resurfacing Project

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four, is pleased to provide information for the Swinton Avenue resurfacing project, from S. 10th Street to NE 4th Street/Lake Ida Road in the City of Delray Beach.

Construction Cost: \$1,482,069 Construction Start: April 14, 2020 Anticipated Completion: Early 2021

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Milling and resurfacing the existing travel lanes and shoulders
- Adding 5-foot wide sidewalk on the west side of the roadway from S 10th Street to S 3rd Street
- Drainage, signage and pavement marking upgrades including roadway striping for shared use travel lanes
- Minor signalization improvements to existing equipment
- Minor tree removal (approximately 20 trees)

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Lane closures are permitted, daily, 7 a.m. until 6 p.m., Monday through Friday
- Lane closures will be permitted on Saturday, 8 a.m. until 4 p.m., if no conflict with existing special events
- Daily lane closures will not be permitted in school zones during reduced speed limit timeframes
- Full closures may be needed on occasion for daytime drainage installation across the roadway; advanced notice will be provided prior to any closures
- Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times


